Bromont International is hosting both the **Canadian Championship** for Preliminary, Intermediate, Advanced and FEI-2* CDEs and the **2017 ADS North** American Intermediate Championship.

The FEI-2* division is a World Championship qualifier for eligible athletes.

<u>This is a CAC format event</u> giving drivers the option to select all competitions in the same division or cross-enter between divisions. See Article 901.10.6. <u>Drivers must be eligible</u> for each division/competitions entered (see 913.3).

<u>Use the CAC Entry Form</u> for all entries – download from the Omnibus web page under "Entry Form"; or request from <u>driving@internationalbromont.org</u>
<u>Entry Form</u> – select either <u>CDE</u> (all competitions in the same division) or <u>CAC</u> (choice cross-enter CDE divisions or to enter a CT (combined test - a choice of any listed dressage test and cones competition from those offered.)

<u>Entry limit</u> - drivers may submit a maximum of two entries in any CT; or one CT and one CDE; or two CDE in national level divisions. Use a separate CAC Entry Forms for second entry. (ADS North American Intermediate Championship criteria stipulates no second entry may be accepted.)

<u>Second entry</u> (if same horse/pony/VSE at this event): Dressage must be different tests or second as H/C; Marathon one competition only; Cones must be different class or second as H/C.

<u>ADS North American Championship</u> open to drivers who have not completed more than one CDE above Intermediate division after June 30, 2015 or in a World Championship since 2012. Minimum entry qualification is three completed ADS-recognized CDEs or DTs in Intermediate division. Drivers must be an ADS member in good standing and may not enter a second entry at a championship event.

Canadian Combined Driving Championship open to Canadian drivers entered in a Preliminary, Intermediate, Advanced or FEI-2* division CDE.

FEI division 1*/2* entries - athletes must have their national federation (USEF or EC) authorize their entry and update the FEI entry system.

<u>Entry acceptance</u>: Completed entries must be legible, signed and include applicable fees, deposits and copies of membership and horse papers; and be received by the closing date.

<u>Special needs, sharing and scheduling requests:</u> must be indicated clearly on the entry form before closing date to be considered. Subsequent additions/changes after closing date may incur late fee charges.

Organizer reserves the right to refuse any entry; modify the schedule; or combine or cancel any classes.

Note: All vehicles to be wheel-measured at Presentation area before competing.

CAC Marathon:

CDE and CAC entries to select one from the following list per entry:

- Training 3 sections, maximum: obstacles. 5, gates 3, approximate distance 12 km (reduced for VSE and small ponies)
- Preliminary 3 sections, maximums: obstacles 6, gates 5, distance up to 14km.
- Intermediate 3 sections, maximums: obstacles 7, gates 5, distance up to 15km.
- Advanced (CAN) and FEI-2* 3 sections, maximums: obstacles 7, gates 6, distance up to 17km.

Marathon Terrain - Rolling hills, woods, open fields, grass / dirt road, bridge and water crossing

Additional Considerations/Comments -

Twice around limitation: any shared combination of driver/groom/navigator/carriage may participate a maximum of twice on Marathon.

Request must be indicated clearly on both driver's CAC entry forms.

Second entry: any one horse/pony/VSE may participate once only on Marathon at this event.

All sharing requests must be indicated clearly on both driver's entry forms to be considered and are subject to management discretion and scheduling requirements.

Safety check: all entries must hand in completed Safety Checklist to Safety Inspector 15 minutes prior to starting Marathon.

General Information

Event conducted under Equine Canada Section C - Driving rules available at http://tinyurl.com/njy4kd4 (free download) available in both English and French. A short listing of EC/ADS rule differences will be posted and made available to all competitors.

Protective headgear - all persons must wear securely fastened protective headgear whenever riding a horse or aboard a carriage at all times at the event location. (Article C928).

Membership: American Drivers must provide proof of PL&PD insurance and be a current USEF or ADS member or pay the ADS non-member fee \$30;.

<u>Canadian Drivers</u> must hold a valid EC Sport License for highest division entered (Training or Preliminary = bronze; Intermediate = silver; Advanced = gold; FEI = platinum).

Eligibility/qualifications:

- <u>FEI division</u> drivers without a FEI star rating may enter CAI-1* for dressage and cones and optional Advanced (CAN) marathon class. Drivers require FEI 2* rating or higher to enter CAI-2* classes. All FEI entries must be registered and have permission to compete from: USEF (American drivers) or Equine Canada (Canadian drivers).
- National divisions Training, Preliminary, Intermediate and Advanced (CAN) entries (see Article 913.3 for eligibility) have 3 options:
- 1. <u>CDE</u>: Enter all 3 competitions (Dressage, Marathon, Cones) in the same division. Entries are eligible for competition/class and overall awards.
- 2. <u>CAC</u>: Cross division entry select one competition for each division qualified to enter. Entries are eligible for competition/class (not overall) awards only. (Article 901.10.5)
- 3. <u>CT</u>: Select any one of listed Dressage tests and one Cones competition per entry.
- 4. <u>Partner entry</u> two eligible drivers per turnout. The competing driver must be declared prior to each competition/class. All other class rules apply. This entry does not qualify for overall division awards. (Article C943.2.16).

Equine Passports – horse/ponies entering the FEI 1* or 2* divisions must have valid FEI Passports. Canadian resident horses entering Advanced, FEI 1* or 2* divisions may have either the FEI passport or the new EC National Passport (effective January, 2017).

Veterinary/Health Requirements: All horses and ponies - Negative Coggins certificate no older than January 3rd, 2017.

US horses: Each horse entering Canada from the USA must be tested with negative results for Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA), using either the AGID or ELISA test, within 6 months of entry into Canada (see further note below), and requires an original US Origin Health Certificate (VS FORM 17145) certifying the date of EIA test and that the horse was inspected and found healthy within 30 days of entry into Canada. Be sure to use the US Origin Health Certificate as opposed to the Interstate Health Certificate. The VS FORM 17145 is issued by an accredited veterinarian and must be endorsed by the USDA veterinarian in the state of origin. Horses can enter Canada from the USA at any port of entry. Their health certificate is inspected and released by Canada Border Services Agency officers (Canada Customs). They frequently keep a copy – so bring 1 or 2 extra copies. Keep a copy of your health certificate required for return to the USA. The VS FORM 17145 is valid for up to 90 days for return to the USA provided the horse has been at recognized

exhibitions/competitions in Canada during the entire stay and provided that the EIA test is still valid, i.e. the horse must have been tested within 6 months of the date of return to the USA. Paperwork for horses returning to the USA within 30 days of entering Canada are inspected and released by US Customs officers. Only horses returning to the USA after a stay of over 30 days in Canada must be inspected by a USDA veterinarian at the US port of entry. **Dogs must be on leash** at all times while on the site. Nuisance or loose dogs will be impounded; retrieval fine: \$50.

Awards: All entries are eligible for each division/turnout/class. Dressage and Marathon presented at Saturday evening dinner. Cones, Overall*, championships and special awards presented Sunday in the arena following each division. *Ribbons to fourth place for turnouts competing in all three competitions in the same division.
